What They Do:

- Pharmacy technicians assist licensed pharmacists in providing medication and other healthcare products to patients.
- Technicians perform routine tasks to help prepare prescribed medication, such as counting tablets, labeling bottles and preparing IV's and drug compounds.
- Technicians also perform administrative duties, such as answering phones, inventory replenishment, order management and insurance billing.
- Pharmacy Technicians work in retail pharmacies, mail-order pharmacies, hospitals, nursing homes, assisted-living facilities, grocery stores, department stores and mass retailers.
- Pharmacy Technicians work with patients, coworkers and healthcare professionals and require strong customer service and communication skills.

- Prepares the student for the Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam (PTCE) and the Exam for the Certification of Pharmacy Technicians (ExCPT) national exams.
