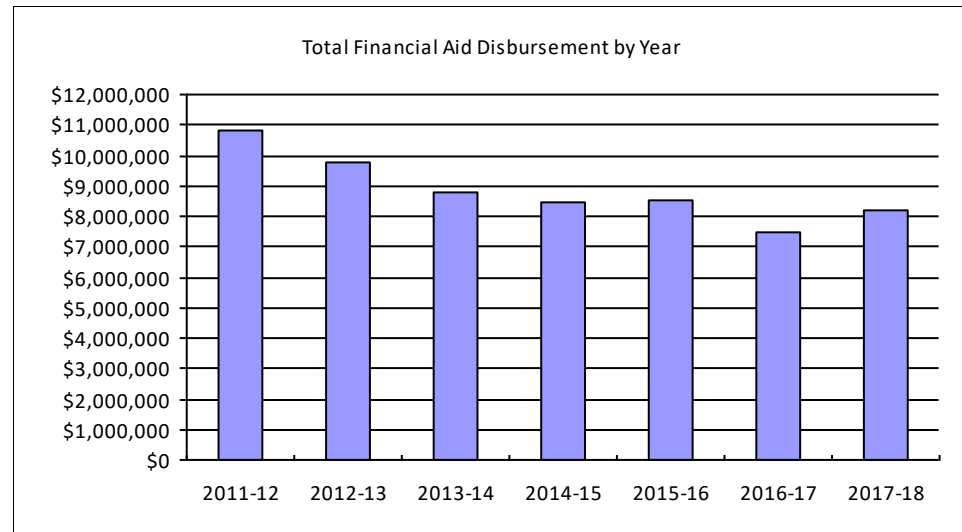

Barton Financial Aid Facts --

- The average financial aid package offered to Barton students for 17-18 was \$6,668, which was a combination of federal, state, institutional and other aid.
- The largest financial aid award paid to a Barton student in 17-18 was \$22,000.
- 100% of Barton county 2017 high school graduates received some type of financial aid in 2017-18.
- 74% of the Federal Aid applicants (FAFSA) processed for 17-18 were eligible for a Federal Pell Grant. 47% of the applicants were eligible for the maximum Pell of \$5,920.
- 45% of students taking at least one BartOnline class received financial aid, VA or Tuition Assistance (or a combination).
