

## Trails to the West: An Annotated Guide to Selected Sources on Kansas, the Great Plains, and the American West

The primary purpose of this annotated bibliography is to support the relevant Agriculture, Anthropology, Arts, Economics, English, Geography, History, Literature, Philosophy, Political Science, Religion, and Sociology classes taught at Barton Community College, and to encourage faculty members and students to utilize the resources of the Barton Library and the Cohen Center for Kansas History for supplementary reading and study. Scholars not affiliated with the College may find the guide equally useful for their own research endeavors.

The first two columns (Author(s) and Title) are self-explanatory, and the third (Publication) reflects either the first edition as a starting point, a revised edition, and/or the edition(s) held in the collections of the Barton Library or the Cohen Center. The fourth column (Notes) contains annotations on the work in question, while the fifth column (Location) states the specific collection, when applicable, that holds the work:  $BL = Barton \ Library$ ;  $CC = Cohen \ Center$ ;
