Public Domain: Referring to an idea, work, or product, that is not protected by intellectual property rights, therefore freely available for public use, without credit or payment given to the creator.¹

Fair Use: Conditions under which copying is not an infringement of US copyright, which permits copying for purposes such as criticism, comment, news, reporting, teaching, scholarship, and research.²

Open Access: Immediate, online research articles and materials coupled with the rights to use these articles fully in the digital environment at no cost.³

OER (Open Educational Resources): Teaching, learning, and research materials that are either (a) in the public domain or (b) licensed in a manner that provides everyone with free and perpetual permission to engage in the 5R activities.⁴
