## Graduation Exit Survey

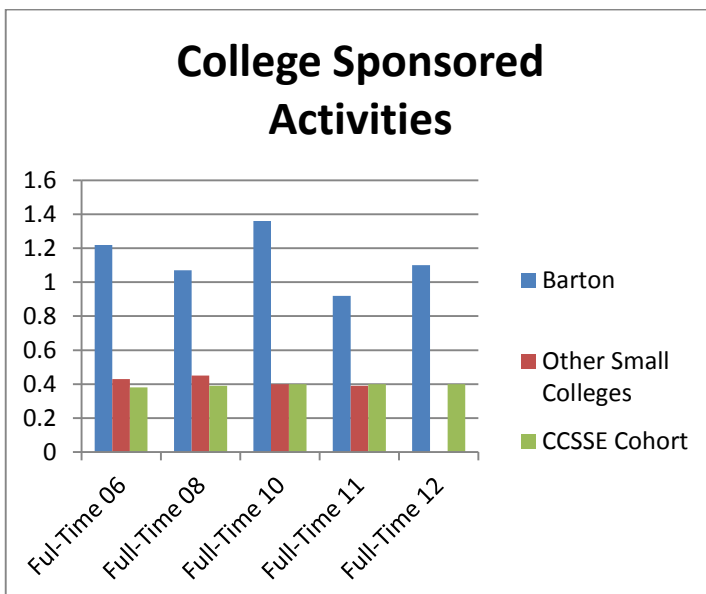

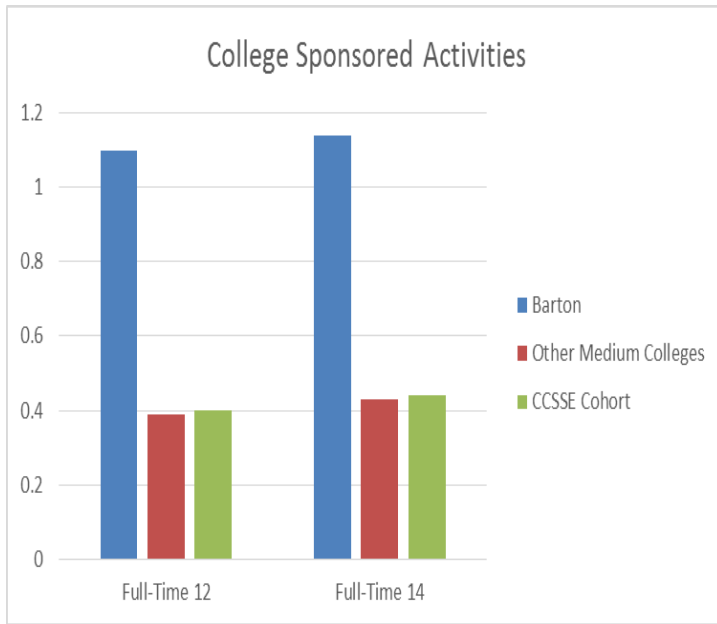
Graduation Exit Survey required of all students who wish to graduate. This survey has been collecting data since 2007.
