- By linking Barton's training programs to our industry partners we are ensuring students are meeting the standards, knowledge and skills required to enter into the workforce.
- Academic and Career Technical Education programs continue to work to develop Program Learning Outcomes. The Program Learning Outcomes drive what a student should be able to demonstrate in terms of knowledge, skills, and abilities upon completion of the program. The assessment of these outcomes results in information that program leaders can use to guide programmatic adjustments.
- Academic and Career Technical Education programs also continue to work to develop Course Outcomes that exhibit what knowledge, skills, and abilities students should achieve upon completion of a specific course.
- Industry required or recommended licensures and certifications also ensure that we are providing the appropriate training, skills and knowledge in our programs.
- 10 of our programs achieved a 100% Certification/Licensure pass rate (Early Childhood, Certiport MOS-Access, Certiport MOS – Excel, EMS Instructor/Coordinator, Welding GTAW, Welding GMAW, Registered Nursing, Practical Nursing, Pharmacy Technician and Medical Assistant). A total of 20 programs were above 80% in their Certification/Licensure pass rates.
