



Happy 50th Anniversary Foundation

This year the Barton Community College Foundation will celebrate its 50th Anniversary! All great institutions exist because of the vision and foresight of those who believed and committed themselves to excellence. The BCC Foundation stands on the shoulders of giants: Bruce W. Buehler, Boyce P. Hardman, Lloyd L. Jaynes, J. Alfred Casad, Jack O. Goodman, J. A. Mermis, Jr., Dale E. Oliver, C.O. Robinson, Marshall S. Macy, H.P. Thies, Donald Whelan and Dale H. Weller. On May 2, 1967 these twelve visionaries signed the Articles of Incorporation establishing the Barton County Junior College Endowment Association as the fund raising entity for the formation of Barton County Junior College (currently known as Barton Community College Foundation, and Barton Community College, respectively.) It is impossible to fathom the impact that action continues to have on all

Barton county communities from that day to this. The economic, cultural and educational climate of our community was forged from that action and continues to flourish these 50 years later.

The legacy of those founders, coupled with the support of each and every donor since that day, have made an impact on the lives of tens of thousands of students who have passed through these doors. We cannot begin to imagine the positive influence that is alive and well, and contributing to the growth and prosperity of all the communities benefitting from the education those students received at Barton Community College.

The Foundation was started with an investment of \$1,000 and today it boasts assets of over \$8,000,000. This year the Foundation wishes to dedicate all of its fundraising efforts, each campaign, initiative and event, to our founders with lasting gratitude and unending admiration for their dedication, hard work and commitment.

2017 Academic Enrichment Fund Campaign

BUILDING ON TRADITION - FORGING THE FUTURE

The theme of this year's campaign, "Building on Tradition – Forging the Future" pays tribute to the vision of the college founders. On May 2, 1967 twelve area

businessmen signed the Articles of Incorporation to establish the Barton County Junior College Endowment Association, as the entity that would raise the funds necessary to establish Barton County Junior College (currently known as Barton Community College Foundation, and Barton Community College, respectively). That fund began with \$1,000 and today the Foundation's assets exceed \$8,000,000.

The AEF campaign is a direct mail campaign that runs the entire month

of March each year. This year Teresa and Dr. Mike Malone will serve as co-chairs of this initiative.

Designed to raise funds for academic scholarships and program enhancements, the Academic Enrichment Fund campaign is unique in that it allows donors to specialize their gift by choosing which department or fund they would like their donation to benefit. The mechanism for donation is also designed to be as simple and easy as possible, with potential

donors receiving a letter with a return envelope and a simple form to complete and return. People can also contribute online at **bartonccfoundation.org**.

"It's an honor to serve as the co-chair of the AEF campaign," said Teresa, who is also serving as First Vice Chair of the Foundation Board of Directors. "The college is good at being involved in the community to meet its needs. They fund new programs to that end, like the CDL, Welding, and Natural Gas programs to name a few that assist in filling skilled labor gaps in the area."

She further added, "Many people underestimate the college's benefit to this area, it is important to sup-

port Barton and its students whenever possible."

The co-chairs for this campaign are crucial to its success. Teresa and Mike are both long-time supporters of the Foundation and have served Great Bend and Barton County through their respective businesses, so they know first-hand the economic and cultural impact of Barton Community College on all the communities it serves.

Mary McKay Nursing Endowment Established




