## Athletic Training

Athletic Trainers (ATs) are highly qualified, multi-skilled health care professionals who collaborate with physicians to provide preventative services, emergency care, clinical diagnosis, therapeutic intervention and rehabilitation of injuries and medical conditions of the physically active.

### Why Barton?

#### Instruction

- Small class size that encourages/supports one-on-one interaction with faculty.
- General education courses that successfully transfer on to college/university under-graduate programs.
- A curriculum designed to provide several prerequisite courses needed for the student pursuing a Master's degree in Athletic Training.

#### Student Support

- Faculty who genuinely care about students success.
- Student support system organized to help students achieve academic success.
- The opportunity to join Barton's athletic training student staff and work with 25 inter-collegiate sports.



#### Transfer Support

- Students pursuing a career in athletic training must successfully complete a specific program of study leading to a Master of Science degree in Athletic Training, and pass the Board of Certification (BOC) for the Athletic Trainer exam.
- College and university master's degree programs vary in regards to the method of delivery (3+2 or traditional master's degree program), admission requirements, the preferred undergraduate degree, and specific prerequisite courses. It is important to select an appropriate undergraduate program as soon as possible once choosing to pursue a career in Athletic Training.
- With BOC certification, and state specific licensure, positions dealing with athlete injury care can be obtained in high schools, colleges & universities, professional sports, and the performing arts; physician offices and clinical settings & hospitals; progressive corporations and industries; the military and public safety; and, various entrepreneurial endeavors.

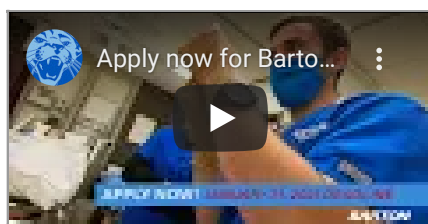
The 2022-2023 school year applications are now closed. Applications for the 2023-2024 school year will open in October.

### About Barton Nursing

Barton offers 2 types of programs for people wanting to enter the field of nursing: Certificate in Practical Nursing (PN) and an Associates in Applied Science Degree in Nursing (ADN).

Whether you are interested in becoming an LPN or an RN Barton Community College can meet your needs. We welcome your interest in nursing and encourage you to come in to discuss your educational possibilities and take a tour of our new nursing area.

### What does Barton offer?

- Practical Nurse (PN) program: Certificate (45 credit hours)
- Registered Nurse (RN) program: Associate of Applied Science Degree
- Well-rounded and demanding coursework
  - Prepares students with nursing skills needed to start their careers
  - Provides nursing education from pre-birth to death
- Clinical partnerships allow students to gain nursing experiences in the various aspects of nursing including obstetrics, pediatrics, mental health, intensive care, and medical-surgical units.
- State and nationally affiliated Barton Nursing Club allows students to interact with other students and network with health care professionals.
- Faculty members with experience in nursing, up-to-date education in nursing skills and teaching techniques.
- Excellent new facilities including two simulation labs.

### Practical Nurse (PN) Program Registered Nurse (RN) Program

A student completes the first two semesters of the program to earn a PN certificate and is eligible to take the NCLEX-PN® to become Licensed Practical Nurse. The graduate can then decide to continue their education or enter the work force.

When the LPN wants to continue their education they may apply for the second year of the nursing program, graduates will receive the Associate in Applied Science degree and is eligible to take the NCLEX-RN® to become a Registered Nurse.

Practical Nurses care for the sick, injured, persons with disabilities or convalescent. They bring their caring, sympathetic natures to hospitals, home health care services, nursing care facilities, physicians' offices and other health care providers and agencies. PNs work under the direction of physicians and registered nurses.

Registered Nurses are health care professionals responsible for implementing the practice of nursing through the use of the nursing process in concert with other health care professionals. RNs work as patient advocates for the care and recovery of the sick and maintenance of their health. RNs use the nursing process to assess, plan, implement, and evaluate nursing care of the sick and injured. RNs also provide advice and emotional support to patient's family members.
