From the Athletic Director

Greetings once again Cougar Nation! Can you believe the weather we have enjoyed throughout January and now most of February? Just wait, I will remind you we are in Kansas. :) This wonderfully mild weather pattern probably only means one thing, a nasty spring in store for us. :(

Speaking of spring, most all of our spring sports teams have begun competition in their respective seasons. The baseball team is off to a 6-1 start, while softball opens the very young season at 1-3. Men's & women's tennis are actually competing in their first tournament of the season as I write this letter. Both the men's & women's golf teams will get underway later in March.

The Region VI Indoor Track & Field Championships were held in Manhattan, KS this past weekend and with an array of injuries as well as some sickness to the Barton athletes, our men & women both finished as runner-ups for the Region Title. How KJCCC rules and regulations apply to Barton:

Under NJCAA Rules, schools around the country have the opportunity to offer awards to student-athletes in upwards to "full-rides", i.e., providing the full cost of a student-athlete's education (Tuition, fees, books, housing, and meals)

Under KJCCC Rules, Barton and other conference members are restricted in offering student-athlete awards to not exceed the cost of tuition and books. *Student-athletes achieving a 3.5 gpa may be eligible for other additional awards not to exceed \$1000 per academic year.

Track and Field finishes second at Region VI Indoor Championships

The Barton men's and women's track and field teams

both finished second in the 2012 Region VI Indoor Championship this past weekend at Ahern Field House in Manhattan. The Cougars will spend the next two weeks training and healing injuries in preparation for the 2012 NJCAA Indoor Championship March 2-3 in Lubbock, Texas.

The Cougar men came up three points short of Johnson County CC as the team champion was determined in the final event of the day, the 4X400 relay. Barton trailed by one and needed the win but Johnson beat out the Cougars by .53 to capture the

championship.

The Cougars won six events on the day highlighted by sophomore Jharyl Bowry. Bowry captured first place in the high jump, second place in the long jump, and third place in the triple jump on the way to earning the Outstanding Male Field Event Athlete award. Bowry won the high jump at a national qualifying 2.00m despite he had not competed in high jump this year. In the long jump Bowry captured second at 7.33m then rounded out his field events by adding a third place in the triple jump with a jump of 14.29m.



Tony Green closed out the field event first place finishes for the Cougars with a 14.89 winning jump in the triple jump.

On the track Barton scored wins in 60m, 400m, 800m, and 60m hurdles. Akeem Haynes captured the 60m with a time of 6.83. Aliaksandr Linnik, who almost made up the deficit from the anchor position of the 4X400 relay, won the 400m with a time of 49.31. Tayron Reyes and Demetrius Lindo rounded out the first place finishes on the track by winning the 800m in 1:57.76 and 60m hurdles in 8:18 respectively.



The Lady Cougars held an eight point lead on Coffeyville CC headed to the 4X400 but due to injury Barton's second seeded relay team was unable to compete. Coffeyville finished second in the event which closed the gap to earn a tie with Barton for second place.

Highlights - Women

The Lady Cougars won five events with Janee Mickens and Yakaterina Miroshnikova each winning two of the four. Mickens won the shot put and weight throw with heaves of 13.90m and 16.27m respectively. Miroshnikova won the mile run in 5:26.50 and the 1000m in 3:00.86, both nearly five seconds in front of her nearest competitor. Agata Klimovich captured Barton's other first place with 57.47 time in the 400m.
