Mike Warren - Head Coach

Mike Warren is in his 29th year as the head baseball coach at Barton. Through 28 seasons, Warren has accumulated an overall record of 954-681, good for a .714 win percentage. His teams have won five Jayhawk Conference Western Division championships and two Western Sub-Regional championships. Warren has surpassed the 800-win mark at Barton with a career record of 857-571

Over the past several summers. Warren has seen four of his former pitchers find their way

into Major League Baseball: Steve Edlefsen (San Francisco Giants), Nate Field (breaking in with the Kansas City Royals and this past season with the Florida Marlins), David Sanders (Chicago White Sox), and Jason Stanford (Cleveland Indians) have made it big in the Big Leagues. In addition, three Cougars were selected in the first eight rounds of the 2006 MLB Draft: Chad Lee (pitcher, 4th round, Oakland A's), Jeff Christy (catcher, 6th round, Minnesota Twins), and Nate Hedrick (pitcher, 8th round, New York Mets).





Brent Biggs Assistant Coach

Brent Biggs is in his 5th year with Barton, returning to the school that he started his collegiate career at. Biggs played for the Cougars in 2005 and 2006. He began his coaching career in 2008 in the Northwoods League.

Biggs was a 1st team all Jayhawk West selection his sophomore year at Barton as a 2nd baseman. That season his hit .300 as well as fielded .958. His freshman season, Biggs was an honorable mention selection to the All West team. Biggs started 105 of 108 games. He played at Fort Hays for two seasons earning Honorable Mention All MIAA his senior season with the Tigers.
