Mission

- In fulfilling its educational mission, Barton Community College attempts to make optimal use of its resources.
- The President will make these recommendations to the Board of Trustees based on the
 college's mission of emphasizing academic, vocational-technical, and cultural
 enrichment learning opportunities; coupled with the need for maintaining program
 integrity, financial viability, and responsiveness to internal and external college
 constituencies.

The Board of Trustees reviews the mission officially each year usually in June when they receive the Board END 7 Strategic Planning report.

Presidents Staff/College review of Mission

During the spring semester time period, assigned groups will be requested by the Institutional Effectiveness Office to review the institutional mission and the assigned group leader will report discussion outcomes to Institutional Effectiveness. The Dean for Institutional Effectiveness will report no later than end of April to the President's Staff.
