





Dear President Law:

I appreciated your letter of January 27 and your understanding of the financial challenges we face for the remainder of this fiscal year, as well as fiscal year 2004. As you know, last session nineteen Republican senators and two Democrat senators voted to increase taxes more than \$250 million per year to avoid deep cuts in education and other social programs. This year, Governor Sebelius has not proposed any revenue measures, and I do not expect any to be made. Therefore, the size of the available "pie" is set and the only thing to be negotiated is how it is sliced.

While it is still early in the session, I expect the final budget will look much like the Governor has proposed with one major exception. Since she has proposed a zero ending balance, and it appears very likely that revenue forecasts made in early April will be less than projected last November, there will have to be some further reductions in budgeted spending to achieve the zero ending balance.

I realize I'm not telling you much that is positive for funding for community colleges or anyone else. I think many more people, myself included, believe we will not see strong revenue growth for a few more years, and we must adjust planned spending accordingly. Please know that legislators are proud of the accomplishments of our community colleges and the major role they play in preparing the Kansas workforce. We will simply do the best we can to allocate limited resources fairly.

Thank you for taking the time to write and for your work to improve education in Kansas.
