# **Computer Aided Drafting & Design**

Are you interested in architectural or engineering drafting? Barton County Community College has a new 21 hour computer aided drafting & design certificate program. In this program students will learn to solve problems in one or three dimensions, and visualize in 3D and gain skills they will need as they prepare for their career. Courses will be offered starting this summer. Some of the courses will be strictly face-to-face, and the other courses students will be able to choose between face-to-face or online. Upon completion of the program some of the career choices are detail drafter, layout drafter, design drafter, drafting trainee, or checker and technical illustrator. The instructor for the program will be an area architect, Jill Fitzsimmons.

### That Time of the Year!!

Yes, it is that time of the year to file your taxes. It is important that you file as soon as you receive your W2s. Once your taxes are completed, call to make an appointment to file your FAFSA for 2012-2013.

### Selective Service Registration

All U. S. male citizens between the ages of 18 and 25 years of age must register for the selective service. You should register 30 days before or 30 days after your 18th birthday. If you fail to register during this time, you This is the information we will need: you will need to bring your 2011 income tax return and W2s. If you are under the age of 24, not married or have no children, you will need to bring your parents 2011 income tax return and W2s. If you are not sure about your filing status, please feel free to ask when making your appointment and we will assist you in determining your status.

may submit a late registration until your 26th birthday. If you are a male noncitizen living in the U.S. ,you are required to register before your 26th birthday. Failing to register makes you not eligible for Federal student loans and grants, which include

Pell Grants, work study, and student loans.
