Why choose a career in wind energy? Kansas ranks third in the nation



for potential wind energy production. The job opportunities are numerous. Qualified technicians are able to find jobs locally, nationally, and even internationally. Graduates

of the program will have the necessary skills to obtain a position with a commercial wind farm company, or a career connected to either the production of wind energy or the usage of wind energy. Annual earnings for people working in the wind energy industry range from \$36,000 to \$67,000.

Several colleges offer

Certificates in Wind Energy or Renewable Energy Technology, but Cloud County Community College is the only college in Kanas approved to offer an Associate of Applied Science degree in Wind Energy Technology. The average cost of attendance ranges from \$2,752 to \$17,800.

ACT Exam Registration

Registration is open for the October 27, 2012 ACT exam.
Students who wish to take the exam must register by
September 21, 2012. Students may register online or by mail.
The online address is www.actstudent.org and you can obtain a paper registration from a school counselor or request a registration packet from ACT.

The cost for the ACT (no writing) is \$35.00, and the cost for the ACT Plus Writing is \$50.50. Some students may qualify for fee waivers due to the fact they cannot afford the

price of the exam.
