CKEOC Outstanding Participant: Edina Purser

When Edina Purser came to the United States from Hungary as the newlywed spouse of a soldier, she spoke very little English. She knew that language would be a significant barrier, but because education was such an important goal for her, she got to work right away. With hard work, perseverance, support from her husband, and help from television, college staff, and TRiO-Central Kansas **Educational Opportunity Center** (CKEOC), Edina has already achieved so much. With a Certificate in Veterinary Medicine and an Associate of Science in Liberal Studies already under her belt, Edina has just put the finishing touches on a Bachelor's of Science in Social Science with a minor in Psychology.

In order to overcome the language barrier, Edina turned to a more non-traditional method. Edina explains, "My English skills were self-taught by watching TV sitcoms with sub-titles all

the time. With hard work and a lot of frustration I learned how to speak, read, and write enough to pursue my education." Unfortunately, as soon as she was ready to start college, she was confronted by another barrier. Edina needed a high-school transcript in order to start her college program. She had a high school education from her native country, but there were several issues in trying to get her transcript translated to a format that schools would accept. Edina relates, "At that point I thought it would be better to get my education here. So, I went back to school and received my GED Diploma from College America."


With all barriers removed, she then enrolled at the Colorado Academy of Veterinary Technology, eventually graduating with a Certificate of Veterinary Medicine.


When Edina's husband, Scot, received orders to Fort Riley, KS, Edina decided to return to school – this time to pursue an Associate's degree in Liberal Studies at Barton Community College. It was during her time at Barton that she was referred to CKEOC by her academic advisor to receive assistance with the transition to a Bachelor's Degree program. CKEOC staff assisted her with weighing her options and applying for federal aid.


With funding in place, Edina was able to make the transition from Barton Community College to Upper

Iowa University. Edina conveyed, "CKEOC helped me every time I had a question about something. I am very thankful for having such a helpful person at hand who cares about people and their education. Without CKEOC and the staff I would not have known how or where to go to get any kind of government funding to keep going with my education. If the CKEOC advisor wouldn't have shown me the way, I possibly would have stopped at the Associate in Science degree."

Thankfully she did continue her education and proudly walked the stage recently to receive her Bachelors of Science in Social Science with a Minor in Psychology. Edina's primary career goal will require her to now take the next step in her education. She explains, "I am going to







very hard for me with English being my second language. A lot of times I did not understand what the professors were talking about, but college made me stronger and smarter. It made me realize I can do anything and has given me friends and people I know I can count on when I call." In closing, Edina indicated, "I would like to thank my husband, family and friends for their continued support. I also want to recognize my Barton Academic Advisor, Sicilee Lansbury, Psychology Instructor, Angela Campbell, CKEOC advisor Ray Kruse, and Cecelia Mallams and Andrea Guilday from Upper Iowa University who all helped me to get me where I am today."


TRIO – Central Kansas Educational Opportunity Center (CKEOC) first met with Eric, a recent graduate of Great Bend High School, in September 2018 at a CKEOC workshop introducing program services to his Jobs for America's Graduates – Kansas (JAG*K) class. His participation in JAG*K was helpful because the program provides guest speakers from different career fields, giving students an understanding of what types of jobs are available. At this point, Eric had already taken a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) class as well as some General Education Courses at Barton Community College. Focused and motivated, Eric was already thinking about college and a career beyond high school.

After learning about CKEOC through participation in the JAG*K program, Eric and his mother made an appointment to complete the FAFSA, fill out scholarship applications, and apply for admission to Barton Community

College. Since this first appointment, he has continued to meet with CKEOC staff and take advantage of services. Eric indicated that CKEOC "is a great program" which has "helped me a lot!"

Eric currently works at Great Bend Health &

Rehab Center as a CNA. This experience, along with the satisfaction he receives from helping others, has helped guide him to select healthcare as his academic focus. He is considering Medical Lab Technician and Licensed Practical Nursing



Now that Eric is transitioning to post-secondary education, he hopes to continue being active in and out of the classroom. In high school he made contributions to the school district by serving as a translator, as well as interpreting for parents during conferences. These activities contributed to his earning the Seal of Biliteracy - an award given by a school, school district, or state in recognition of students who have studied and attained



proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation. Eric was successful in the classroom and in sports balancing academic and athletic pursuits in wrestling, basketball, and football.

When Eric's time isn't occupied by work or school, he enjoys spending time with his family and friends. His family consists of his father, mother, and younger sister, Crystal, who will be a senior at GBHS in the fall. Eric wants to "just try to reach the top because my parents never had this opportunity." His ambition for success and achievement is an example for others to follow. CKEOC is pleased to assist Eric in accomplishing his goals and is pleased to name him an Outstanding Participant.

Financial Aid is also touched on to help participants understand how to obtain funds for an affordable (and hopefully debt-free) education. Campus visit attendees are also explained the wide array of class options that are offered, including online and evening classes, to help them receive an education that works with their busy schedules. Participants

always seem surprised and

encouraged by the amount of student services college campuses deliver. Services such as tutoring, counseling, campus jobs, and social clubs/events help provide the support students need in order to succeed in college. The campus visits do a great job of keeping the participants involved and receptive of the information they receive and the students always ask the speakers valuable questions.
















ACT Test Dates
