- 1. For all locations, the number of full-time students testing into 1 or more developmental areas has stayed about the same (42% to 43%).
- 2. Looking at campuses separately: *GB campus 53% to 54%* and *Ft. Riley 46% to 47%*.
- 3. For GB campus: the percent of students who tested developmental and actually enrolled in the needed DE courses has doubled. (advising and redesigned courses)
- 4. Pass Rates remained consistent in English and Reading on the GB campus.
- 5. Pass rate in math fell to 79% which we expected at this point after the redesign. {79% still one of highest pass rates in state} Into 4<sup>th</sup> year number of students has grown each year; the number of students now in the higher level modules increased; finish 3 instead of 4 is fail but next semester start where left off.

  Students fail from non-attendance more than from failing grades. If they come to class they get the instruction and help they need to learn the curriculum.
- 6. Big Picture: majority of students completing dev ed sequence in  $1-1\,\%$  years compared to the  $2-2\,\%$  years before the redesign. Pipeline has been shortened.
  - Retention of low-performing students has increased from 50% to 56.3%. Better chance of completing a certificate of degree program.

    Seeing positive change in student attitudes and study habits overall.
- 7. Dodge City CC visiting DE lab September 30<sup>th</sup>.
