Students completing the Early Childhood Education Program in the School of Family Studies and Human Services are eligible for licensure by the Kansas State Department of Education in early childhood unified, birth through kindergarten. Program degree requirements are subject to change to meet licensure requirements. The early childhood unified, birth through kindergarten license combines early childhood education and early childhood special education content knowledge and pedagogy in one blended pre-service teacher education program.

This Early Childhood Education program is designed for students who wish to work in early education programs in administrative or teaching positions, including work with parents and community agencies, as well as with young children, aged birth through kindergarten, including children with special needs.

Note: Kansas Board of Regents requirements have been incorporated into this degree plan, including the following rules governing bachelor's degrees:

- a. A bachelor's degree must include at least 124 credit hours;
- b. It must have at least half of the credit hours earned from an institution where the majority of degrees granted are at the bachelor's degree level or higher;
- c. It must include at least 45 credit hours at the 300 level or higher;
- d. It must include at least 45 credit hours of general education in defined areas.

Kansas State University will accept up to one-half of the required credit hours (or 62 credit hours) from the two-year institution toward the bachelor's degree.
