Note: Kansas Board of Regents requirements have been incorporated into this degree plan, including the following rules governing bachelor's degrees:

- a. A bachelor's degree must include at least 124 credit hours;
- b. It must have at least half of the credit hours earned from an institution where the majority of degrees granted are at the bachelor's degree level or higher;
- c. It must include at least 45 credit hours at the 300 level or higher;
- d. It must include at least 45 credit hours of general education in defined areas.

Kansas State University will accept up to one-half of the required credit hours (or 62 credit hours) from the two-year institution toward the bachelor's degree.
