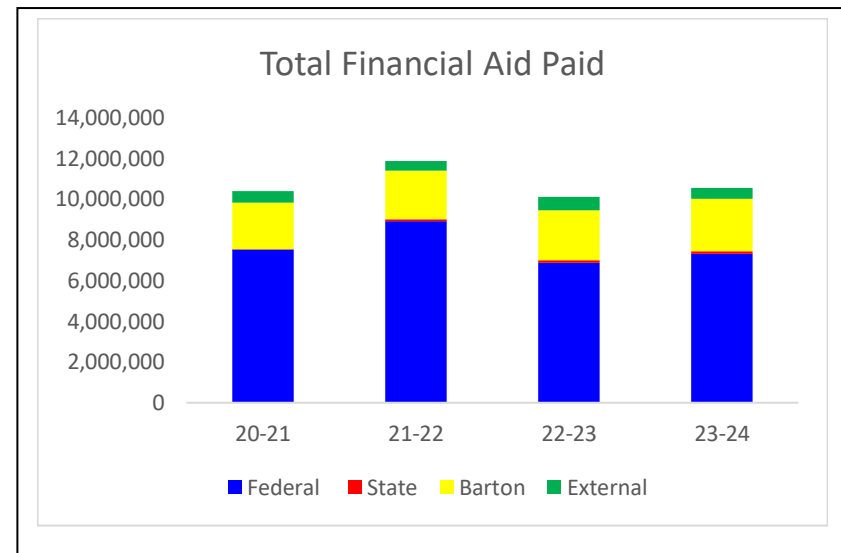

### Barton Financial Aid Facts:

- Barton County residents received \$1,580,380 in financial aid in 2023-24.
- On average, 86% of first-time/full-time students attending Barton receive some type of financial aid according to data submitted to the National Center for Education Statistics for 2022-23.
- 2,107 students received financial aid in 23-24. The average award was \$2,407. The largest total paid to one student in 23-24 was \$22,592.
- Maximum Federal Pell Grant for Fall/Spring for 2023-24 was \$7,395.
