Barton offers 2 types of programs for people wanting to enter the field of nursing: Certificate in Practical Nursing (PN) and an Associates in Applied Science Degree

in Nursing (ADN). A student completes the first two semesters of the program to earn a PN certificate and is eligible to take the NCLEX-PN® to become Licensed Practical Nurse. The graduate then can decide to continue their education or enter the work force.

When the LPN wants to continue their education they may apply for the second year of the nursing program, graduates will receive the Associate in Applied Science degree and is eligible to take the NCLEX-RN® to become a Registered Nurse.

What are the differences in levels of Nursing?

Practical Nurses (PNs): Care for the sick, injured, persons with disabilities or convalescent. They bring their caring, sympathetic natures to hospitals, home health care services, nursing care facilities, physicians' offices and other health care providers and agencies. PNs work under the direction of physicians and registered nurses.

Registered Nurses (RNs): A health care professional responsible for implementing the practice of nursing through the use of the nursing process in concert with other health care professionals. RNs work as patient advocates for the care and recovery of the sick and maintenance of their health. RNs use the nursing process to assess,



plan, implement, and evaluate nursing care of the sick and injured. RNs also provide advice and emotional support to patient's family members.

What does Barton offer?

- Practical Nurse (PN) program: Certificate (45 credit hours)
- Registered Nurse (RN) program: Associate of Applied Science Degree
- Well-rounded and demanding coursework
 - Prepares students with nursing skills needed to start their careers

Occupational Outlook and Earnings

- Practical Nurses (PNs):
 - Projected to grow faster than average with overall job prospects expected to be very good. The best opportunities will occur in nursing care facilities and home health care services.
 - Average earnings range between \$31,080 to \$43,640
- Registered Nurses (RNs):
 - Overall job opportunities for RNs are expected to be excellent and expected to grow much faster than the average.
 - Average earnings range between \$47,710 to \$69,850

TEAS Nursing Test

The TEAS V assesses the academic preparedness of entry-level nursing students in Reading, Math, Science, and English and Language Usage. A TEAS V Study Manual and online practice assessments are available for the

students to use for preparation and review at <u>ATI Testing</u>. Make sure you study for the TEAS V test. If you took a different version of the TEAS test you will have to take the TEAS V test.

When taking the TEAS V, students will demonstrate reading skills in paragraph comprehension, passage comprehension, and inferences and conclusions. The math section will measure their knowledge of whole numbers, metric conversion, fractions and decimals, algebraic application, percentages, ratio and proportion, and data interpretation. Science covers scientific reasoning, life science, chemical science, physical science, human body science, and general science. And in the English section, students will tackle punctuation, grammar, sentence structure, contextual words, and spelling.

Curriculum Guides

Barton Nursing Programs are approved by the Kansas State Board of Nursing. The Associate Degree Nursing Program is also accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) through 2022.

Starting in 2006, Barton became a 1+1 nursing program. What this means is Barton's nursing program will have an application process for both levels of the program.

To enter the Practical Nursing Program, you must complete the application process and be able to pass a background check. For more information on the admissions criteria, contact the Nursing Department at 620-792-9357. After completing the PN Program, you will receive a Vocational Certificate.

Entry into the RN Program requires completion of Barton's PN Program or another recognized Practical Nursing Program, completion of the application process and the ability to pass a background check. At the completion of the RN Program you will receive an Associate in Applied Science Degree. Completion of either the PN or RN Programs makes you eligible to take national licensure examinations for Licensed Practical Nurses and Registered Nurses.
