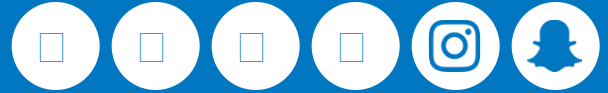

Developmental Education Courses

READ 1108 | Basic Reading | 3 credit hours

This course provides a means for students to develop reading skills necessary for college reading. This basic level course focuses on techniques for word recognition, vocabulary development and on fundamental comprehension skills.

READ 1109 | Intermediate Reading | 3 credit hours

This course is designed to promote the development of study skills, vocabulary skills, and comprehension skills needed for college reading. Intermediate Reading classes are also offered in a paired class format with a core subject class.

ENGL 1190 | Basic English | 3 credit hours

This course emphasizes basic writing techniques. Course content covers grammar, word usage, sentence structure and paragraph structure.

ENGL 1194 | Intermediate English | 3 credit hours

This course concentrates on improving writing skills necessary for successful performance in college courses and in most careers.

ENGL 1209 | English Comp with Review | 5 credit hours

This course is a five credit hour course for students with placement scores below college level in writing. Students in this course attend a regular English 1204 class followed by an hour of additional instruction/review with the same instructor. English Comp 1 with Review is designed to improve student learning outcomes and to ensure success in the college level course.

MATH 1798 | Jump Math | 2 credit hours

This course provides the opportunity for students to master math skills that they need to have to be successful in their chosen academic/career goals.

MATH 1821 | Basic Algebra | 3 credit hours

This course covers fundamental algebraic operations, factoring, algebraic fractions, linear and quadratic equations, exponents and radicals.

MATH 1813 | College Prep Math I | 3 credit hours

To provide the opportunity for students to master math skills that they need to have to be successful in their chosen academic/career goals.

MATH 1815 | College Prep Math II | 3 credit hours

To provide the opportunity for students to master math skills that they need to have to be successful in their chosen academic/career goals. This course is a continuation of College Prep Math for students who still need to complete 3 or more modules in the math sequence.

MATH 1817 | College Prep Math III | 3 credit hours

To provide the opportunity for students to master math skills that they need to have to be successful in their chosen academic/career goals. This course is a continuation of College Prep Math for students who still need to complete 3 or more modules in the math sequence.

MATH 1825 | College Prep Math IV | 1-2 credit hours

To provide the opportunity for students to master math skills that they need to have to be successful in their chosen academic/career goals. This course is a continuation of College Prep Math for students who still need to complete one or two modules in the sequence.
