Beginning August 11th, the Barton County campus changes back to regular hours: Monday through Friday from 7:30 am - 4:30 pm




Happening on Campus

It's been a busy summer here on Barton County's campus! In addition to regular summer session classes, Upward Bound hosted their yearly summer camp. The Upward Bound Program prides itself on serving students from diverse backgrounds who aspire to complete a college degree. All students must either have their family meet income guidelines set by the U.S. Department of Education or be potential first-generation college students. Barton Community College first sponsored the Barton County Upward Bound (BCUB) Program in 1999 and added the Central Kansas Upward Bound Program in 2007. The Upward Bound program concentrates on building success by improving academic skills and involving high schools students in activities that will expose them

to the world around us the workplace, careers, educational institutions, and the cultural aspects of our society.

Primary class format you teach?

I teach College Algebra at Great Bend High School as part of the College Advantage Program.

How long have you been teaching? 37 years

How long have you taught for Barton Community College? 14 years

What's your favorite part of your school day or class time?

My favorite part of the school day is guided practice. I love to see the transferring of knowledge from my instruction into a student's actions.

If you could go back and offer your first-year teaching version of yourself some advice, what would it be?

Do not assume that because you "told" your students some information that they will remember what you said or did. Even if a student answered a problem correctly on a given day, do not assume that they will remember that information a week later. Mastery of any skill requires independent and repeated practice and some students will require multiple presentations of the material to achieve mastery. Also, the most important accomplishment in your school day is to build relationships with your students so that they will want to perform at their best ability.

Tuition Changes for Spring 2015

Barton Community College tuition will remain the same for the Fall Semester 2014, \$84 per credit hour for Barton County residents, \$91 per credit hour for non-Barton County residents, and \$137 per credit hour for BARTonline classes. Hybrid classes will still be assessed a \$15 hybrid fee.

However, for the Spring Semester 2015, tuition is expected to increase by \$6 per credit hour in each sector to the amounts of \$90 per credit hour for Barton County residents, \$97 per credit hour for non-Barton County residents, and \$143 per credit hour for BARTonline classes. Hybrid classes will still be assessed a \$15 hybrid fee.

College Planning Conference

Choosing a college is a big decision. To help make that decision easier, the Kansas Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (KACRAO) is pleased to host a college planning conference for high school and transfer students in your area.

The Great Bend College Planning Conference will take place from 1:30 to 2:30 on Monday, October 20, 2014, in the Great Bend High School gym.

This event will give prospective students the opportunity to gather information about public and private colleges, universities and technical schools in Kansas and the region. Representatives will be available from each institution to answer questions about academic programs, financial assistance opportunities, student life and athletics.

There will be approximately 300 high school juniors and seniors in attendance from the surrounding area high schools. There will be over 40 college representatives.

Certification Rosters

Fall Semester

If you teach a year-long class, you will receive an email from the Office of the Registrar in September. This email lists instructions for how to certify your class rosters through your PAWS account.

Year-Long

If you teach a year-long class, you will receive an email from the Office of the Registrar in September. This email lists instructions for how to certify your class rosters through your PAWS account.

Spring Semester

If you teach a semester-long class in the spring, you will receive an email from the Office of the Registrar in January-February. This email lists instructions for how to certify your class rosters through your PAWS account.

If you haven't yet seen this email, please check your spam filters in your email inbox. Sometimes those filters catch our . edu addresses and file them away.

Certifying rosters is a very important part of your responsibility as associate faculty members. If you have received the email but not yet completed it, please sign into your PAWS account and do so immediately. If you have technical issues when you reach the PAWS sign in page read through the directions listed there. If you need your Barton ID number, use the Lookup ID button and verify your information. If you're a new PAWS user, your PIN is your six-digit birthdate. If you have signed in before but forgotten the password you reset, please use the Forgot PIN? button.

If you are still unable to sign in, please contact Enrollment Services at (800) 748-7594 or (620) 792-9252. Their contact information is also listed on the sign in page, should you need to contact them.

Classroom Assessment Techniques


(CATs, for short)

Submitting a CAT only takes a few minutes!! Submission/ Documentation of the CAT can be done using the following link: www.tinyurl.com/submitCAT

We ask that you submit one CAT for every CRN that you teach, so please enter the CRN on the form, not the course number. For courses with multiple CRNs tied to them, there is a field where multiple CRNs may be entered on the form.

If you made a change of any sort after performing your CAT in your classroom, answer Yes to the final question. For example: Deciding not to teach a lesson based on the fact that your CAT determined your class already understood the material is still a positive changed based on a CAT, so you should answer Yes.

After you click "Submit," the following web page will load to confirm submission:



If you think that you submitted a CAT, but it didn't get to us, please consider these possibilities:

- Did you click Submit? It's fairly common to fill out the information and close the information before clicking the Submit button.
- Did an error message pop up when you completed your CAT? There are required fields on the form, and if any of those are left blank, the form won't be processed.
- Did you type your Course Reference Number (CRN) correctly? The most common errors made when submitting
 CATs is to mistype the CRN or to complete more than one
 CAT while duplicating the CRN. The survey is set to accept
 one CAT per CRN and will not correct you if you've typed it
 incorrectly.
