Dan Swinton's 2-13-19 email replying to the question: My question is should we start implementing changes or wait to see what happens.

We are (understandably) hearing this question a lot right now. We have taken the position of recommending that schools implement many of the changes now. Those who take a "wait and see" approach will likely be well behind when the Regs are finalized.

I think hearings (whether in front an administrator or a panel) are here to stay (definitely in the 6th Circuit), though the cross examination piece is likely to get adjusted somewhat for the rest of the country. I would suggest enhancing training for decision-makers ASAP. To that end and by request of many, many members, ATIXA has launched a new hearing officer/panel/decision-maker certification training (https://atixa.org/events/training-and-certification/title-ix-hearing-officer-training/). Our first one is in Chicago in March: https://atixa.org/events/training-and-certification/student-conduct-hearing-board-training-at-lutheran-school-of-theology/

Other due process-related elements are also increasingly being adopted by courts and are becoming industry standards, such as: A more thorough investigation, providing support to both parties, applying the least restrictive means possible for interim measures, more robust training requirements, and providing the parties a copy of the report for review before making a decision.

We also completely updated 1P1P to reflect virtually all of the proposed regs – at least where the requirements exceeded current practices. Where the Regs retract (e.g.: limiting who is designated as a Responsible Employee; minimizing when an institution is on notice or must investigate), we maintained higher and more comprehensive standards.
