Assessment ~

- ~ is a rich conversation about student learning informed by data. ~ Ted Marchesi
- ~ is an on-going process in which useable feedback is reflected upon by the students and teacher to improve student learning.
- ~ produces a helpful product that enables faculty to make curricular improvements the purpose of which is to increase student learning.
- ~ ensures our constituencies that we do what we advertise, provide quality education.

Assessment is not ~

- ~ simply giving tests or assigning grades
- ~ a statistical exercise
- ~ *a fad*

Questions to pose about student learning ~

- ~ What do we know about student learning?
- ~ What do we think we already know?
- ~ How will we use information to make positive changes?

 - X Develops and maintains the College's Assessment Plan
 - **X** Provides assessment training opportunities
 - **Reports to the College community on Barton's on-going assessment efforts**
- ~ The Barton Assessment Plan
 - X Describes the implementation of assessment activities at the Classroom, Course, Program, and Degree Levels
- ~ Administrative Support
 - **Ensures that assessment <u>results</u>** are not used for faculty evaluation
 - Guarantees that assessment results are used to make improvements that will enhance student learning
 - X Strongly encourages every faculty member to regularly incorporate assessment activities into the classroom
 - ★ Requires each faculty member to document at least one Classroom Assessment Technique (CAT) every semester

- 8. is supported through on-going training and budgeting process.

Rationale Statement

Barton's Outcomes Assessment Committee exists to design, implement, and facilitate processes which will be used primarily to improve student learning through making positive changes in the Barton curriculum. Once established, these assessment processes guide individual instructors and departments in making informed decisions about their instructional methods, delivery, and curriculum. These assessment processes also provide information which allows students, community members, state and federal agencies, and accrediting agencies to recognize that Barton is fulfilling the promises of the College's mission. The implementation of assessment processes necessitates changes which may be difficult at times; despite these challenges, the Committee believes strongly that by working together, all members of the Barton community have the potential to make an excellent institution even better.
