ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Corrections Officer program provides training and education to prepare students to serve as correctional facility staff. It also offers the opportunity to serve an industry that rehabilitates and assists with public safety.

Program developed in collaboration with the Kansas Department of Corrections; curriculum developed by corrections industry experts.

Advantages of the Program

- » Program suitable for current correctional employees as well as individuals interested in joining the corrections industry team.
- » Individuals must be 18 years of age to serve as a corrections officer; however, high school students can get an early start on this career path via online coursework with some courses supported by SB#155.
- » Completion of this program may lead to promotion with the corrections system.
- » The Corrections program offers both a certificate and degree level program of study. All coursework is delivered via online instruction. This convenience eliminates travel to a classroom location and partners well with work and personal schedules.
- » Industry selected faculty and dedicated advisement assists students in achieving completion of the program and their career goals.
- » Students working towards completion of the program may transfer up to 15 college credits into the degree program from successful completion of the Department of Corrections Basic Training.
- » The program is financial aid eligible. Barton's cost for online coursework is \$150 per college credit plus textbooks.
