Subject: HWWT (Hazardous Waste Worker Training) Grant Project Advisory Board Meeting update

VP Simmons,

Lindsay attended the NIEHS-PETE HWWT Grant Advisory Board Meeting last week in Pittsburgh, PA, here is a summary of our report card at this point in time:

General Observations:

- (1) Overall numbers continue to be very good
- (2) Evaluations continue to be consistently superb. I analyze all evaluations for all courses looking for anomalies or patters where certain courses may be rated consistently lower, but, have never found any inconsistencies.

Student Evaluation, Disaster/Hazmat Training:

To date, there have been seven classes with a total of Ninety-nine (99) students who have completed either the 80-hour course (5 classes, 77 students) or the shortened 40-hour course (2 courses, 22 students). Three classes were held at Fort Sill, Oklahoma and Fort Carson, Colorado and one class at Fort Riley, Kansas. Of that number, all ninety-nine (99) students completed a course evaluation which represents 100%.

Evaluator Summary:

In summary, the conclusion drawn by the evaluator is that Barton Community College is a premier training provider delivering high quality training to their students. The expertise and knowledge of their instructors is well documented, the course content was determined as excellent, and students were very well satisfied with their learning experience. It's also important to mention that there was virtually no difference between the evaluations from one Army post to another. They were very consistently excellent. No deficiencies or concerns are noted.

James Henderson is the primary instructor and Lawrence Weber has facilitating one class. Sarah Ball and Walter Brown have provided support as Lab Assistants during week 2 of the 80hr classes.

Tis the season for NCLEX and I wanted to give you a quick update on how we are doing this year for the NCLEX-RN and the NCLEX-PN.

As of 7/2/19, We have heard from all of our 2019 PN graduates and all have passed the NCLEX-PN for a 100% pass rate. Many are still waiting on their license, but it is a very busy time at KSBN. This is the third year in a row for this amazing accomplishment!!

As of 7/2/19, we have heard from all of our 2019 ADN/RN grads and we only had one student that did not pass the NCLEX-RN on her first attempt. With these results, our ADN/RN pass rate will be 92.3%.

I am so very proud of the Nursing faculty and our Nursing students for all of their hard work. Definitely something to make us Barton Proud!!
