2435-Barton Distinguished Instructor Award

<u>Awards</u>

(as modified, 10/7/2013)

In an effort to recognize reward academic excellence, in the various venues at Barton Community College, five Distinguished Instructor Award has been <u>Awards are established. Two awards will be given: one</u>, to be awarded at the end of the Spring semester in each school year.

> 1. One award is established for a fulltime faculty member-and one to an associate faculty member.* at the Ft. Riley campus (to include Main Post, Custer Hill, and Grandview Plaza).

Nominees must be in good standing with respect to their job performance. Fulltime faculty must have taught a minimum of three years at Barton. Associate faculty must have served as a faculty member for three years with a cumulative

teaching load of 18.0 credit hours. Nominces may 2. One award is established for a full-time faculty member* at the Ft. Leavenworth campus.

3. One award is established for a fulltime faculty member* at the Great Bend campus.

4. One award is established for a faculty member on Bartonline (to include all

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instructors teaching online more than four courses on average annually for at least two years).

5. One award is established for an associate faculty member at any location and in any medium (to include all instructors teaching at least two classes annually for at least two years).

*Nominees cannot have received the the Distinguished Instructor Award Award within the past five three years.

Rules:

A.) Nominations may be mailed or emailed and must be received by any Faculty Council Representative, no later than April 1 of any school year. Any Barton employee (administration, faculty, or staff) can nominate a fulltime or associate faculty member for the Distinguished Instructor Award. Nominations should address the following criteria and should be submitted in letter format to the Vice President of Instruction and Student Services by April 8th. Nominations may be mailed or emailed. <u>May Submit</u>

nominations. Nominations from official student organizations, such as Phi Theta Kappa and Alpha Sigma Lambda, are welcome. All materials and information received will be held in confidence.

B.) Awards are annually determined in the late spring, if there are worthy candidates. Faculty who are currently engaged in a Personal Improvement Plan, or who have recently failed a PIP, are not qualified to receive the DIA.

C.) Each award will be determined by a committee appropriate to that teaching area, which will consist of the following:

(1) One representative of the administration (preferably with supervisory expertise),

(2) One representative of Faculty Council, and

(3) One at-large faculty member (preferably with experience in the medium or at the venue).

D.) Award winners will be selected based upon demonstrable excellence in three categories of service:
