Go to www.bartonline.org and click on the ENROLL NOW tab. Fill out the personal information, making sure your social security number and graduation year are correct. Barton requires no admission application or fee.

Current Students: If you are already a Barton student with access to an online course shell from taking either a face-to-face or online class, click LOGIN and then click the ADD link on the left hand side and follow the prompts.

BARTonline charges ***\$133** per credit hour. Textbook costs and potential lab/course fees may apply. Select career technical courses are available to sophomore, junior, and senior high school students at no cost except textbook and program fees. If you are taking an eligible career technical education class, please mark "payment by check" and continue with registration. Tuition costs will be automatically paid by Senate Bill 155 upon enrollment completion.
