*Dare to Know*

### Christmas Fiction

*Fiction that focuses on the celebration of the Christian and secular holiday of Christmas.*

A genre in which stories focus on Christmas as a framing device in order to explore various themes. Some authors may wish to discuss poverty and social injustice in the world, while others simply promote kindness and generosity. Christmas stories can possess a materialistic message, or those writing in **historical fiction** or **romance fiction** might use the holiday as a setting for the narrative. Drawing from **Christian fiction**, some stories may share “the Good Word” and the religious meaning of Christmas while emphasizing testimony, missionary work, and evangelism. E. T. A. Hoffman’s *The Nutcracker and the Mouse King* (1816), Charles Dickens’s *A Christmas Carol* (1843), Hans Christian Andersen’s “The Fir-Tree” (1844), Fyodor Dostoevsky’s “A Christmas Tree and a Wedding” (1848) and “The Beggar Boy at Christ’s Christmas Tree” (1876), Arthur Conan Doyle’s “The Adventure of the Blue Caruncle” (1892), O. Henry’s “The Gift of the Magi” (1905), Dylan Thomas’s *A Child’s Christmas in Wales* (1952), Kurt Vonnegut’s “Christmas Contest” (1952), Truman Capote’s *A Christmas Memory* (1956), and Agatha Christie’s *A Christmas Tragedy* (1932) and *The Adventure of the Christmas Pudding* (1960) are classic examples.
