Romantic Suspense Fiction

Fiction that depicts romantic love in plots that likewise feature mystery and suspense.

A sub-genre that incorporates **thriller** (or suspense fiction) and/or **detective and mystery fiction** elements into the **romantic fiction** plot. While the focus of these stories remains on the romance itself, they contain tropes common to mystery or adventure novels such as surviving ordeals, confronting stalkers, conducting espionage, and solving crimes (e.g., kidnapping or murder). Victoria Holt's *Mistress of Mellyn* (1960) is a classic example.

Validates readers' appreciation for the concepts of love and affection

Teaches readers about communication, commitment, loyalty, and problem solving in relationships
