This genre often depicts the life of sailors during specific historical periods, such as the Age of Sail (17th and 18th centuries), or in different parts of the world, including the Caribbean and the Mediterranean. The novels may feature naval officers, sailors, or pirates as the central characters, and they often delve into the intricacies of ship life, naval warfare, and maritime traditions. Johann David Wyss's Swiss Family Robinson (1812), James Fenimore Cooper's The Pilot (1824), Edgar Allan Poe's The Narrative of Arthur Gordon Pym of Nantucket (1838), Robert Louis Stevenson's Treasure Island (1883), Rudyard Kipling's Captains Courageous (1897), Rafael Sabatini's The Sea Hawk (1915) and Captain Blood (1922), C. S. Forester's Beat to Quarters (1937), Herman Wouk's The Caine Mutiny (1952), Frans Gunnar Bengtsson's Long Ships (1954), and Patrick O'Brian's Master and Commander (1969) are classic examples.
