A sub-genre in which the world has become the opposite of a utopia and the protagonist must liberate himself or herself or an entire community. Stories often include horrid societies, deep social control, and exploration of what we fear will happen in the future of humanity. Dystopian societies in science fiction provide a platform for readers to figuratively remove themselves from and look critically at their own time. Science fiction comics can use the intensity of sequential art to create situations not bound by reality in order to satirize, critique, or warn audiences of contemporary society's failings.
