Bowling:

431 students bowled in 8 events. Head count is by shoe rental. There are always some students that come and hang out to visit. The highest attendance is 112 and lowest is 32. Two vans are used to take students to the event and give them the option for a Walmart stop after bowling.

Ice Cream Social:

This event takes place in the fall at the start of the semester and again in the spring semester. In the fall, the event includes a photo booth to help students ease into conversation and interact for the first time. Fall 2018, there were 169 students and in the Spring of 2019 125 students. Total of 294. At least 5 volunteers assist with this event.

Late Night Breakfast:

368 students attended 2 events. This is set up at the end of each semester. In December Santa makes a visit and in May the event includes a photo booth. It takes about 8-10 volunteers. The volunteers are usually the same each year. They enjoy serving the students and having short conversations with them as they go through the line. Great Western Dining donates the food and preparation and we provide the service.

Movie Night:

Last year there were 795 students attended August 2018 - June 2019. That was 19 events. The highest attendance was 77. Transportation is provided. Two vans or the Elite bus is used for transportation for the events. Students have the option for a Walmart stop afterwards.

CATv: (catv.bartonccc.edu)

CATv is an on campus movie streaming site that is available to housing students and the commuter students while on campus. 20 newly released movies a month, 12 television season programs per academic year, pool of 200 movies per semester, plus awareness videos for our use. The movies are continually advertised and a quick connect is available on the student life web page. <u>Usage Aug. & Sept. 2019</u>.
