Other Colleges in the state of Kansas that I am aware of with Shooting Sports Team:

FHSU & Pratt Community College

- These clubs/teams include some recruited members, but mainly consist of students already attending the institution
- The shooting sports teams are not a part of athletics. They are separated partly because of liability, but mostly because there is no affiliation with NCAA or NJCAA competition membership
- Fees charged per credit hour classes to help pay for ammunition
- Students expected to assist with payment of tournament entry fees out of own pocket

Projected #of Student Athletes participating in Barton Shooting Club/Team:

- FHSU currently has 19 Team Members *(had 5 team members in its first year of existence) *(random club shooters who don't compete, but just shoot for fun equates to over 60 students)
- Pratt CC has approximately 15 Team Members who compete annually, but attract over 30 additional kids to campus who shoot as part of the club or are enrolled in the outfitting or ag programs

8-10 Competition Events in the state of Kansas & 2 Regional Competitions

Notes for possible recruitment/start-up:

- Recruiting advantage as very few other colleges in Kansas offer such an opportunity
- Chance for many high school shooting sports enthusiasts to compete while continuing their education
- Start-up costs would be significant if the college is to provide guns & ammunition for the club/team members as good shotguns range from \$500-\$1500/each & ammunition will run approximately \$6/box
- Consideration will have to be made for compensation of either full time coach or part time sponsor
- Local shooting clubs support interest of young people in the sport & are willing to assist in such programs
- Scholarship is random in such programs, but certainly necessary for start-up
