MY COACHING PHILOSOPHY

My coaching philosophy is quite simple and is like that of teaching. In coaching you must bring out the best in your athletes. DEVELOPING PLAYERS

It is my belief that the success of the Neosho County Basketball program has come from the focus on individual player development. It is critical to the team's opportunity for success. At the college level all players have varying degrees of athletic ability. What we feel has separated Neosho players from other players in junior college is the development of our players.

Pure athleticism will only get a player so far. When playing for a conference championship and playing in the NJCAA National Tournament, all the players on the floor will be great athletes. Only the player with finely developed skills will be able to separate themselves from the competition and help his team to victory.

My staff and I work closely with our players to evaluate what skills they possess. Their strengths and weaknesses must be identified and then a strategy for improvement must be devised.

Daily commitment to the individual practice plan will transform the game of an individual player, thereby allowing him to provide a greater contribution to the team. Players will find that developing skills is hard work, but the success they will have as a result is very satisfying and rewarding.

Ultimately, winning makes all the hard work worthwhile. We ask our guys one simple question...what sacrifices are you as an individual willing to make for the opportunity to play in the NJCAA National Tournament?

I am a firm believer in the quote... "You get what you put into it!"

This is the quote my Dad told me over and over as a kid and I have used it every day of my life. It has also been the backbone of my Neosho County basketball program! Without the hard work we would not have achieved what we have!



STYLE OF PLAY

I coach an **up-tempo style of basketball**. Our style of play is to run and attack! We push the ball up the court at every opportunity. As we push the ball up the court, we look to score - primary break to secondary break, secondary break to one of our pro-style quick hitter sets.

Our primary goal on offense is to play "**team basketball**". To us, team basketball is about not forcing shots, but making the extra pass, and attacking the basket to pass, not shoot! When five guys are playing as one on the court, basketball is a beautiful game to watch.

Besides team basketball, we stress **ball sureness**, catch-and-face, shot fakes, pass fakes, playing off the elbows with dribble penetration, draw-and-kick action, great shot selection, crashing the boards, and getting offensive rebounds.

We will play hard nose defense. Our in-your-face style of defense is our team's greatest way of getting easy buckets! We believe and teach that great defense is all about "heart", "hustle" and "toughness". Our attitude on defense is that we are going to make you work every possession and make life hard for you to score. We are not going to give you any easy baskets!!! We are going to do everything in our power, within the rules of the game, to keep you from scoring - maximum ball pressure, quick help, taking the charge, pressuring the shot, blocking out, rebounding, etc. If you make a great shot, then that is OK, but it is not going to be easy and more than likely it will not happen again.

In my opinion, playing great team defense & an up-tempo style of offence makes a group of guys a true "team". We believe it helps players understand the need for everyone to play as a team, to bond and believe in the power of the group!

OUR GOAL is to be <u>NATIONAL CHAMPIONS</u>! <u>HARD WORK</u> is how we will obtain that GOAL! 64 miles away in <u>HUTCHINSON</u> is where <u>WE WILL</u> <u>WIN</u> OUR <u>NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP</u>!
