Student Support Services

- Serves 200 Barton students who are low income, first generation in college, and/or have disabilities
- 2014/15 award = \$308,746
- Director and Academic Advisor 100% grant funded, Tutoring Specialists and Counselor grant & institutionally funded
- Program Highlight: Jumpstart summer program
 - o Collaboration between the grant, the Foundation, and the institution
 - 2008 Jumpstart participant Edgar Roman employed at Ellsworth Correctional & inquiring about Jumpstart summer 2015 for his younger brother
 - Jumpstart participants commit to attending Barton the fall and spring semesters following Jumpstart or reimburse Barton for their program costs

Educational Opportunity Center

- Serves 1000 adults annually (low income and/or potential first generation in college)
- 2014/15 award = \$263,047
- Offices in Great Bend and Junction City with 5 staff members serving 33 Kansas counties
- Director, Coordinator, Academic Advisors, Secretary/Data Specialist 100% grant funded
- 489 prior year (2013/14) participants were served who were also connected to Barton through GED, enrollment, etc.
- Program Highlight: partnership with Army Education Center

Barton County Upward Bound

- Serves 57 high school students from 3 Barton County high schools (Great Bend, Hoisington, Ellinwood)
- 2014/15 award = \$250,000
- Intensive 6 week residential summer program on Barton campus
- On average, 80% of BCUB participants attend Barton following their high school graduation

- Program/Student Highlights:
 - Alisha Schneweis-completed master program, currently a physical therapist at Clara Barton Hospital
 - Justin Schneweis-in pharmacy school at KU, final year
 - Jennifer Berg- Bachelors in education, teaching art at Central Plains-one of the first to go through the program!
 - Matthew Moyd- working on masters at University of New Mexico
 - Haley Petz-completed Barton's MLT program, currently working at Lyons Hospital

Central Kansas Upward Bound

- Program began: 2007
- Serves 57 high school students from 6 Central Kansas high schools (Chase, Lyons, Central Plains, Wilson, & Ellsworth)
- 2014/15 award = \$250,000
- Intensive 6 week residential summer program on Barton campus
- On average, 80% of participants attend Barton following their high school graduation
- Program/Student Highlights:
 - o 9 former participants have completed degrees or certificates at Barton
 - Former participants have completed certificates (2), associate degrees (8), and to date 1 bachelor degree
 - o 8 current participants are enrolled in 43 concurrent credit hours fall 2014
 - 29 former participants enrolled at a PSEI
