Campus Safety Recommendations

December 2015

1) The internal paging system will be checked, verified, and logged at least once a week by the Campus Safety officers.

- a. All officers will participate to become familiar with the system.
- b. The system may be checked more often as time allows.

2) Meet with local law enforcement agencies to discuss:

- a. Level of Cooperation- Have been in contact with Undersheriff Bruce Green and Fire Chief Napolitano. Will be setting up a meeting to have our security staff meet with them.
- b. Level of Services
- c. Campus Safety
 - o Training/certification
 - Recommendations that Law enforcement may have

3) Enhanced Safety Officer Training

- a. Target Solutions (web based training)
 - National Company that issues training material to a large percentage of EMS, Fire, Law Enforcement and Professional safety.
 - 170 courses ranging from Basic Security Officer Training to Emergency Preparedness and Crisis Management.
 - o Ability to add custom material.
 - Ability to monitor performance closely.
 - o \$948 annually (\$79/seat) with \$500 setup for a total of \$1448 first year cost.
 - This training mirrors what Wichita Area Technical College offers, although Target
 Solutions provides more in depth training and offerings than WATC.
- b. Train the trainer for in house training
 - o Status pending due to subject matter and material dependency.
- c. Contact Contract Services and inquire what training they use pending due to information search.
- d. Check in to reserve and part time officer training
- e. Check for additional training possible in house training by outside vendor.
- f. Work with our own Criminal Justice program to either develop a training program for our Safety Officers and/or select portions of our current curriculum.
- g. Regularly attend Campus Safety related Webinars and online training
 - Tools for Creating Campus Resilience-12/16/15 @ 1230
 - Many are free or low cost The National Center for Campus Public Safety

4) Employee and Student Training

a. Run-Hide-Fight – Twice annually (multiple sessions each time)

- o GBSD LT Steve Billinger is certified in providing this training. LT Billinger stated that he would be able to give a presentation, and possibly provide a demo with the help of other officers. His suggestion would be to provide the presentation to faculty and staff first and then decide if students should receive it.
- Student orientation- film and web site post
- o Professional Conference Day agenda item
- It is possible that once our officers have been through this training, Lucas/Jim could provide ongoing training.
- b. Weekly or Bi-weekly email safety blurb
 - Met with Engle, she stated that she would be able to send the email to the student body.
 - o Lucas would send out the safety blurb to the faculty and staff.
- c. Monthly campus wide EOP training sessions
 - Voluntary
 - o Covers EOP topics
 - o Open to faculty/staff/students
- d. Drills
 - o Plan and schedule for long term pending
 - Active shooter pending
 - Schedule 1 fire alarm drill in the fall and 1 tornado drill in the spring (to align with National testing dates)

5) Enhanced Communication

- a. Print and Distribute Active Shooter cards and booklets from the Department of Homeland Security to all Faculty, Staff, and Housing Students
- b. Change website to show Campus Safety on the front page (Completed)
- c. Change Campus Safety website to include the links to policies and reporting.
- d. Rave Panic Button (For use by select Staff only) & Rave Guardian (For use by all faculty, staff, and students)
 - o Meeting with Rave Representative on 12/3/15 at 10:00 am
 - Bundled package for both programs \$6000/yr. + \$1000 setup
