KANSAS SYSTEM WIDE TRANSFER

- The Kansas Core Outcomes Project was initiated in 1999 by the Kansas Council of Instructional Administrators (KCIA.)
- During Regent Logan's service with the Kansas Board of Regents (2011-2018) he led the charge in mandating system wide acceptance and identification of general education courses that would successful transfer across the system. During this timeframe, the number of courses recognized for system wide acceptance has grown.
- The goal of the project is to develop core outcomes and competencies for general education courses for seamless transfer.
- The Kansas Core Outcomes Group Conference (KCOG) is held annually during the fall semester.
- Faculty from all 32 institutions (universities, community colleges and technical schools) participate in KCOG.
- The following disciplines are represented: Accounting, Anthropology, Art, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Communication, Early Childhood, English, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Sociology, Spanish and Theatre.

- The fall 2018 KCOG conference occurred earlier this month and the following new courses were reviewed: American Literature I & II, Comparative Politics, Introduction to Early Childhood, Marriage and Family, Music Theory II and Principles of Leadership. In addition, 20 other previously approved courses were reviewed.
- A student who completes any of these courses at a Kansas public university, community college, or technical college will be able to transfer the course to any Kansas public postsecondary institution offering an equivalent course.
