

Fort Riley Academic Programs

Director Janet Balk

- Four Degrees (Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, Associate of Applied Science in Business Management and Leadership, and Associate of General Studies)
- Leadership Skill Enhancement Courses (LSEC) (daytime classes), Seven 6-week cycles per year, no cost to students, this opportunity is provided to qualified students via a Barton Scholarship
- College Program (CP) (evening classes), Five 8-week cycles per year, tuition based, books provided to students
- Basic Skills Enhancement Program (BSEP) Eleven 4-week cycles per year
- Civilian Leadership Development Program (DoD Civilians) 12 eight hour sessions OCT-MAR each year
 - Piloting a 2nd six-month session (APR –SEP) in 2021
- Pursuing a joint effort with Dean's Howe and Kottas to add FR/FL LSEC students to Great Bend campus 8-week classes in Fall 21 / Spring 22

Going great:

- > FR staff working together to take care of students
- > Faculty switch over to Concourse
- > Increased number of class offerings at both FR & FL with LiveOnline collaboration

Going good:

- > Instructors using OERs & working through certification
- Collaboration between FR & FL (faculty & staff)
- Closing in on providing ESOL classes

Needs improvement:

- Student involvement with PTK
- Reducing active duty military students who do not utilize Paws for enrollment BARTO
- Getting students to return books/equipment in a timely manner
- Lack of qualified applicants for open faculty positions

- 1) Advisors/Advisement Coordinator provide face-to-face, phone and virtual advising services to FR and FL students. Approx. 64 advising appointments were conducted in the month of November
- 2) Customer Service Representatives assist students coming in to the Barton office by providing them with general information, programs and degrees available, scheduling appointments to meet with advisors, and assisting with enrollments. On average, the front office assists 350 students in-person per month as well as countless phone calls and the occasional Zoom appointment.
- 3) Billing support services assists students pay balances over the phone and in person. We are also responsible for processing 3rd Party military payments to include tuition assistance from all military branches and MyCAA. For 2020.

- > Team works proficiently regardless of work location (in office vs. remote)
- Assisting soldiers to request TA

- Encouraging students to apply for financial aid and letting them know the EOC is available to help them complete the application.

Tier 3 - Third priority, primarily focused on job related skills, unit sustainment training/knowledge.
