- The President and Board must start with agreeance the big pieces (the Mission) first and empower and assist smaller units to deliver the details.
- The basic values of the Mission should drive every decision by the President and the college staff.
- Reports to the board and the Strategic Plan should be based on the preagreed mission. They are reported back to the board as parts of the mission as a whole (ENDs)

Video Transcript
