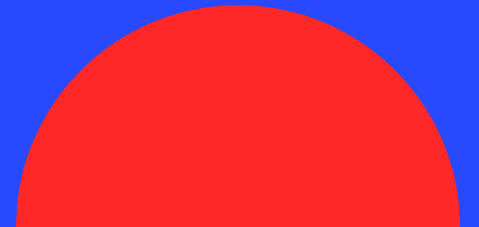
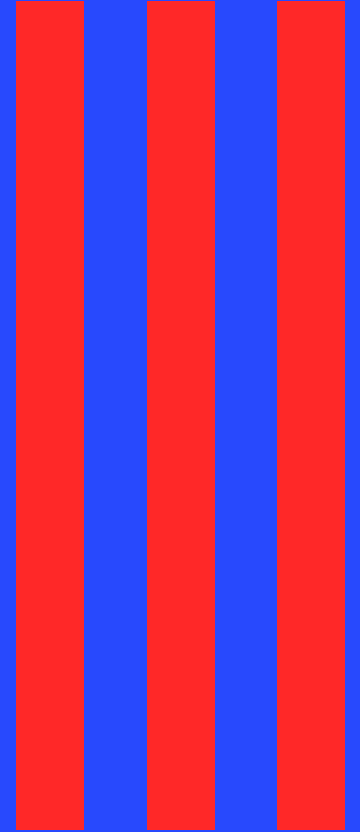

Stop Campus Hazing Act

- Amendment to Clery Act
- Effective January 1, 2025
- Will be included in Annual Security Report in 2026
- Also must create Campus Hazing Transparency Report
- Kansas law has prohibited hazing since around 2010



Stop Campus Hazing Act

- The SCHHA seems to broaden the definition of hazing
- Includes acts done by “a person whether individually or in concert with others...”
- in the course of an initiation... into a student organization...whether the organization is established or recognized by the institution



Stop Campus Hazing Act

Campus Hazing Transparency Report

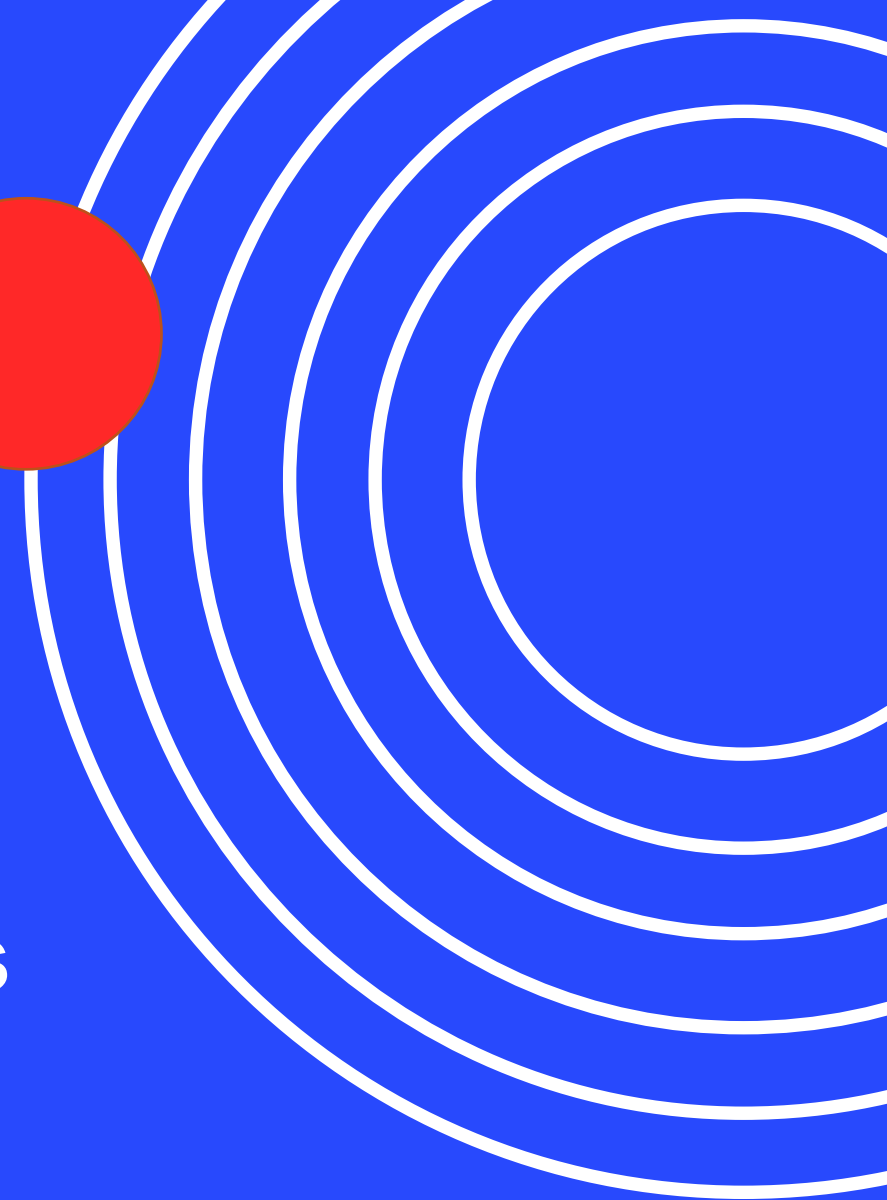
- Summarizes *findings* re any established or recognized student organization found to be in violation of the institution's definition of hazing
- Updated every 6 months unless there is no new incident



Title IX

- **OCR office in KC open**



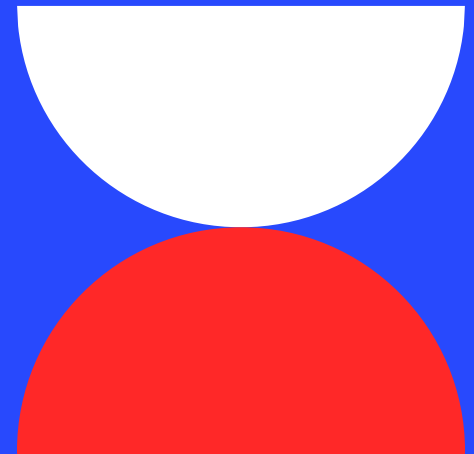

21-5418. Hazing. (a) Hazing is recklessly coercing, demanding or encouraging another person to perform, as a condition of membership in a social or fraternal organization, any act which could reasonably be expected to result in great bodily harm, disfigurement or death [emphasis added] or which is done in a manner whereby great bodily harm, disfigurement or death could be inflicted.

(b) Hazing is a class B nonperson misdemeanor.
