## Kansas Systemwide General Education Program

- KBOR approved in June 2022; fall 2024 implementation
- Board of Regents goal to create a common general education package and facilitate student transfer.
- Framework system for six state universities, community colleges and Washburn University; excludes technical colleges
  - Impacts AA, AS, AFA and all baccalaureate degrees.
    Does NOT impact AGS and AAS
  - New Systemwide General Education Program Policy
  - Amendments to the Transfer & Articulation Policy



#### **General Education Framework**

- Seven areas or "buckets"
  - English Discipline Area 6 credit hours. (Comp I and II)
  - Communication Discipline Area 3 credit hours. (*IPC or Public Speaking*)
  - Math and Statistics Discipline Area 3 credit hours (*College Algebra, Stats or Quantitative Reasoning*); Intermediate Algebra does not meet area.
  - Natural and Physical Sciences Discipline Area 4 to 5 credit hours (must include a course with a lab)
  - Social and Behavioral Sciences Discipline Area 6 credit hours
  - Arts and Humanities Discipline Area 6 credit hours
  - Institutionally Designated Area 6 credit hours
- Total hours of 34 to 35 credits; Barton general education program exceeds this requirement (36-42)

- Adjust college transcripts to reflect "KS Systemwide General Education Completed"
- Complete annual reporting including degree maps
- Work in conjunction with the General Education Council
